Learn about ancient Pueblo life and participate in a dig at Crow Canyon. Talk with a genuine Medicine man and learn about Peacemaker Court from tribal elders. Watch native craftspeople weave baskets, blow glass, and make pottery and talk about its meaning. Pueblo Villages, Santa Fe restaurants and museums, and the Grand Canyon are all part of the May X to Indian Country in the Southwest United States.
