

Furman University Study Away Program: Program Expectations

Program Title: Health and Medicine in the Global Context

Locations: Lisbon, Portugal

Dates: May 8-31, 2024

Program Description: This global clinical course is aimed to provide students an opportunity to examine health care delivery while observing clinical practice in a geopolitical context different from that of the United States. The course will center on the clinical practice and analyze social determinants affecting service delivery, patient experience, and health outcomes. Students will start in Greenville to establish a comparative perspective before departing to Lisbon, Portugal to begin AAMC-compliant clinical observations in conjunction with Atlantis. This course provides an opportunity for students with aspirations of attending health professional schools to gain clinical exposure and firsthand experience to drive comparative analyses of global healthcare models. Students will spend a minimum of 20 hours a week in the hospital environment shadowing n pairs, generally between 9am - 2pm, although the hours will change depending on the day, hospital and specialty. One day per week is reserved for an organized group excursion of cultural, regional or historical interest.
