Program Description: The Edinburgh Internship Program offers studentse a semester longer academic and internship experience in the capital city of Scotland. Students will take two elective courses offered by Edinburgh Napier Univeristy and two courses offered by the Furman faculty director of the program. As part of their coursework, studentes will complete a semester-long internship during their residency in Edinburgh. Internships may include experience in government (Scottish Parliament), media, musuems, non-profits, start-ups, academic research, and business operations as best aligns with each student's area of interest and plan of study.
